Most papers cover the period from the 1950s to the 1970s.
Biography	Paul Tripcony was born at Dunwich on Stradbroke Island in 1901. He worked as a grader driver, machinery man, and road maker. Tripcony was interested in Australian aborigines and their culture and collected aboriginal artefacts. He had an extensive collection of both Australian and overseas literature, which covered his wide range of interests from politics to poetry. His collection included many limited editions and rare items. He died in 1975.
