Biography Roy Parkinson is a Queensland artist known mainly for watercolours. He

studied at Brisbane Technical College and was a member of the Royal Queensland Art Society. He exhibited at the Coronation Exhibition London in 1937 and in the United States. His work is represented in the Art Gallery of South Australia, National Gallery of Victoria, Queensland Art Gallery and

Castlemaine Gallery.
