Biography The Briggs family lived at Clunes, Victoria. Charles Henry Briggs' mother,

Eliza Briggs (nee Rowley) was the daughter of Captain Thomas Rowley. Charles Henry Briggs moved to Sydney and later set up in business at Bathurst and Goulburn. Ernest Briggs, a 5th generation Australian, was descended from Captain T. Rowley and was manager of the Radio Station 4BK in Brisbane in the 1930s. The papers relating to the Briggs family consist mainly of correspondence, which belonged to Charles Henry Briggs and one of his sons Charles James Briggs, and a number of miscellaneous documents such as a tombstone inscription of the Briggs and Rowley families and papers relating to the Australian Natives Association. The newspaper clippings in a bound volume are from the Brisbane *Courier*, the *Telegraph* and the *Chronicle* from December 1894 to April 1895 regarding the case against Rev. Charles Ogg brought by the Presbytery of the Ann St Church. There is also a illuminated parchment testimonial, which was given to Miss Margaret Ann

Others are photographs of Ernest Briggs and the staff of the station 4BK in the 1930s, and there is also one of Miss Margaret Ann Ogg at her house in Windsor. The collection was collected and presented by W.B. Ross (1857 to

Ogg, daughter of Rev. C. Ogg, on her retirement. Most of the studio portrait photographs are from an album of the Briggs family, some with identification.

Correspondence - Outgoing. These letters are in chronological order.

Briggs, Charles Henry

Letter to C.H. Briggs' father, Henry Sparrow Briggs (1796-1866): regarding mainly family news. 1 folded leaf; holograph in ink; good condition.



- **2 3** Letters to his parents dated between 10.10.1857 and 24.6.1859: re gold rush in Ararat and family news. One and a half folded leaves; holograph in ink. A3 is incomplete.
- Letter to one of Charles Henry Briggs' sisters: re the poor condition of his family dated 19.11.1861. 1 folded leaf; holograph in ink; fair condition.
- **5 26** Letters to his mother Eliza Briggs dated 22.4.1863-10.10.1881: re mainly family news, and sometimes including social conditions at some Victorian digging sites and local news of Clunes. 25 folded leaves; holograph in ink; some damaged, others in fair condition. Letter number 26 is dated just March.

27 – 29 Briggs, Eliza

Letters [3] from Charles Henry Briggs' mother, Eliza Briggs, dated 29.3.1882-5.9.1882: re the sale of a block of land in Kingston, N.S.W. and other news of the family. 3 folded leaves; holograph in ink; good condition.

30 – 31 Briggs, F.H.

Letter and telegram from one of Charles Henry Briggs' brothers, F.H. Briggs, dated 26.9.1882-27.9.1882. The letter: re bank draft sent to him and about the progress of the sale of land. The telegram: re the sudden death of their mother. 2 leaves (1 folded, 1 form telegram); holograph in ink; good condition.

32 – 33 Briggs, J.

Letters [2] from Charles Henry Briggs' brother, J. Briggs, dated May 6th 1884 - June 10th 1884; mainly on bank draft sent and the sale of the family home. 2 folded leaves; holograph in ink; good condition.

34 Briggs, Thomas

Letter from Charles Henry Briggs' brother Tom Briggs, dated 21.6.1882: re the sale of the block of land to Mr. Fowler. 1 folded leaf; holograph in ink; fair condition.

35 Cashman, Eliza

Letter from Charles Henry Briggs' sister Eliza Cashman dated 13.5.1883: re some property sales, news of the family, and problems concerning Fanny, his daughter. 2 folded leaves; holograph in ink; good condition.

36 Roberts, Jessie

Letter from Charles Henry Briggs' sister Jessie Roberts dated 14.11.1883: re family news. 1 folded leaf; holograph; good condition.



37 Roberts, W.

Letter dated 29.12.89: re new business in Goulburn. 1 folded leaf; holograph; good condition.

38 Squire(?), J.

Letter from a school teacher undated: re Grace, Charles Henry Briggs' daughter. 1 folded leaf; holograph in ink; good condition.

39 Stitts(?), L.H.

Letter from a schoolteacher, L.H. Stitts(?) undated: re Grace, his daughter and the teacher's views on education in general. 1 folded leaf; holograph in red ink; good condition.

Letters [3] from one of Charles James Briggs' old friends from Clunes, dated 28.9.1884 – 19.3.1885: re news of Clunes and the activities of the local residents.

3 folded leaves (12 pp.); holograph; good condition.

4 – 11 Booth, William E.

Letters [8] from another school friend of Charles James Briggs' from Newcastle, dated 5.1.1885 – 25.3.1886: re life of a young man in Newcastle and his visits to Sydney. The letters give glimpses of the social conditions of this period. 8 folded leaves (30 pp.); holograph; fair condition.

12 Briggs, Charles Henry

Letter [1] from Charles James Briggs' father dated Nov. 15 1897 re his brother Syd Briggs in Perth who wanted to come back home, but his father disapproved of his behaviour. 1 folded leaf (3p.); holograph; good condition.

13 Briggs, Fred

Letter [1] from Charles James Briggs' uncle dated 18.8.1905: re broody hens.1 leaf; holograph; good condition.



14 Briggs, Fannie

Letter [1] from Charles James Briggs' sister dated 17.9.1908: re his loss of his wife, offering of sympathy. 1 leaf; holograph; good condition.

15 Briggs, Grace

Letter [1] from Charles James Briggs' sister undated: re family news and requesting he send her music box to Newtown Station. 1 folded leaf; holograph; good condition.

16 – 17 **Briggs**, Rose

Letters [2] from Charles James Briggs' cousin dated 23.9.1903 and 10.12.1903 re: selling furniture at Kingston house and Steve, her brother, who was found drowned. 2 leaves (1 folded); holograph; good condition.

18 – 23 Creati, I de M.

Letters [6] from Charles James Briggs' teacher at Creswick Grammar School dated 11.6.1885 – 31.10.1885: re news of school activities, his literary activities, the Australian Natives Association, also information about Charles James Briggs being the descendant of Major Johnson, and his appointment as the correspondent for the new Australian Natives Association journal "The National Australians"; also mentions W.D. Deakin and other eminent Australians as contributors. 6 folded leaves; holograph; good condition. Letter of May 15th 1889 incomplete.

24 – 25 Dalrymple, A.P.N.

Letters [2] from Charles James Briggs' solicitor dated 1st Oct 1903 and 1st Sept 1904 re his late father's estate and re maintenance and tuition cost for Grace D. Briggs. 2 leaves; typescript and holograph. Second letter with bottom part torn off.

26 Dalrymple, J.M.

Letter [1] dated 4.2.1890: re referee and references and other family news.1 folded leaf; holograph; fair condition.

27 – 29 Dougan, W.

Letters [3] from Charles James Briggs' friend dated 21.1.1885 – 1.6.1885: re shooting rabbits, racing dogs, etc. in Clunes, as well as news of other Clunes friends and residents. 3 folded leaves; holograph; fair condition.

30 Gerrard, C.T.

Letter [1] dated 15.7.1902 re: procuring a position for Charles James Briggs. 1 folded leaf; holograph; good condition.

Letter [1] undated re: arrangement to meet. 1 folded leaf; holograph; good condition.



33 Gray, Gilbert S.

Letters [3] from Charles James Briggs' friend from Rockhampton dated 20.1.1885 - 9.12.89 re: family news, work, holidays, etc. 1 leaf and 3 folded leaves; holograph; good condition.

Letters [3] from Charles James Briggs' brother-in-law dated 23.8.1885, 30.8.1885 and 14.9.1885 re: emu eggs and copper specimens from Cobar Copper Mine and asking for the Sydney Morning Herald and the price of butter. 3 folded leaves; holograph; good condition.

Letter [1] dated 21.9.1908 re: the death of Mrs. C.J. Briggs.1 leaf; holograph; torn. Letterhead: "The Women's Hospital". With envelope.

Letter [1] dated 15.4.1910 re: the death of Will Middleton(?).1 folded leaf; holograph; good condition.

Letters [3], 1 dated 18.9.1887, another undated re: news from Goulburn. 3 folded leaves; holograph; good condition.

- 11A T Miscellaneous papers including anonymous letters, receipts, instructions, baptism paper, addresses, recipes, tickets, programme, advertising broadsheets, banking forms, etc. including Waiters hours and duties on letterhead of St. Patrick's College, Goulburn in mss. setting out daily routine. Possibly applied to sons of Charles James Briggs.

1 – 23 Photographs of the Briggs family including two mini albums - some photographs have identification. Most of the photographs are sepia - except a few black and white and 3 coloured. Inserted in one of the mini albums is a small drawing in pencil of a man in profile. Photographs are of various sizes.



Series F: Materials and papers which belonged to the Reverend Charles Ogg, Minister of the Ann Street Presbyterian Church, Brisbane and his daughter, Margaret Ann Ogg, pioneer in the field of women in public life.

- Press clippings from the Brisbane Courier and Telegraph, December 1894 March 1895 re the case against the Reverend Charles Ogg brought by the Presbytery of the Ann Street Presbyterian Church, Brisbane. 1 album; without paging; 24 x 31 cm; poor condition. The clippings are mounted on the album pages in chronological order.
- Testimonial 31 December 1930 to Miss M.A. Ogg for "pioneering the cause of women in public life" quotes the Hon. S.M. Bruce, who perhaps was guest speaker at the presentation function. 1 parchment; illuminated; 30 x 40 cm; signed by members of the committee.
