**Biography** Robert Philp, businessman and politician, was born Glasgow Scotland and

arrived in Queensland in 1862. In 1874 he joined merchant company of James Burn in Townsville, and made partner in 1876. After entering state politics in 1886 as member for Musgrave he became Premier of Queensland (1899 to

1903, and 1907 to 1908), as a conservative. He contributed to the

establishment of the University of Queensland.
