**Biography** Alexander Clifford Vernon Melbourne was born in Adelaide on 10 June 1888.

He was a Lecturer and later Associate Professor of History at the University of Queensland from 1913 to 1943. He was a joint member of the University Senate, secretary of the Joint Committee for Public Lectures and Tutorial Classes etc. The collection includes background research material for his work on constitutional history of Australia and notes taken from the Colonial Office records in London. In December 1931 he was sent to Japan and China by the Senate, and later in 1933, he was elected Chairman of the Federal Advisory Committee on Eastern Trade. He researched trade statistics of Japan and China, as well as their treaty obligations and tariff laws. He also contributed articles on Queensland history, etc. regularly to the Brisbane Daily Mail. His collection reflects the activities of these fields. He died on 7 June

1943.

This collection was received in 1945, and some catalogue entries were made, but without any page numbering or other accession controls. It was recatalogued in 1977, by which time it was not possible to determine whether the several categories into which the correspondence was broken up, represented the original order as established by Prof. Melbourne, or that of the first cataloguer. Since several files seemed to overlap in subject content as well as chronology the present arrangement was imposed. The chronological sequence of incoming and outgoing correspondence.
