- **Contents** Correspondence; personal papers; poetry manuscripts; teaching notes and related materials on aesthetics, literary studies and opera; opera reviews; and newspaper cuttings on opera and literature.
- **Biography** Val Vallis was born in 1916 in the small Queensland coastal town of Gladstone. After completing high school in Rockhampton, he returned to Gladstone and found work as a clerk in the local council before being posted to Papua New Guinea in World War 2. Vallis emerged from the war a published poet and returned to civilian life as an arts student at the University of Queensland, majoring in philosophy and English. He went on to complete a masters degree at University of Queensland and a doctorate at London University. Vallis returned to the University of Queensland to teach philosophy and later poetry, quickly establishing a reputation as a lively and engaging teacher. His first volume of poetry. Songs of the East Coast, was published in 1947, and was followed in 1961 by Dark Wind Blowing. Though poetry was his chief passion, Vallis was also a renowned opera enthusiast, for many years serving as opera critic for The Bulletin, The Australian, and the British journal, Opera. After retiring from the University of Queensland in 1981, he accepted a post teaching opera history at the Queensland Conservatorium of Music. Vallis died in 2009, aged 92.
