**Biography** Val Wake started his working life as a copy boy on the Sydney Daily *Telegraph*. During 40 years as a journalist he was a play reviewer for *Plays* and Players of London, an editor of Canadian biweekly the Dawson Creek Star, a producer for the nightly newsreel on ABC Television News, Sydney, and the Arctic editor for CBC Northern Service. While working in Arctic Canada Val Wake was closely associated with reporting the development of the native rights movement across the north. He also made a side trip to the North Pole. For the last 20 years before retiring Val Wake worked for the British Government as an information officer. From 1991 to 1995 he was head of the Central Office of Information Radio Division, working with Foreign Office supplying programme services in support of the British Government's overseas objectives. He and his Canadian-born wife Lillian retired to Port Macquarie in 1996 where he has done freelance work, writing vachting stories and pieces for AQ, the journal of the Australian Institute of Political Science. His father, Robert Frederick Bird Wake was head of Commonwealth security in Queensland during the 1930s-1950s and his godfather Valdemar Augenson who was responsible for finding aerodrome sites in Queensland during the 1920s-1930s. -- adapted from AustLit Notes Unrestricted access Arranged in the following series: Series A: Papers relating to Robert Frederick Bird Wake, 1901 to 1974 -- Series B: Papers relating to Elizabeth Wake (née
